What is the Health Care Core Curriculum (HCCC)?

- A series of entry-level courses for the student with an interest in healthcare but little or no experience!
- Focuses on basic skills needed for working in any healthcare setting
- Emphasizes achievement of relevant competencies
- The first educational step to many health professions
- Standardized curriculum for high school and college partners





Why use the HCCC in College Career Pathways?

- Multiple high schools throughout the state are offering the HCCC in their health science career programs.
- The college health career programs that require the HCCC can be marketed to high school students with the incentive that up to 4 credits can be applied directly to the career pathway





High Schools

- Many of the high schools that offer the HCCC will also be offering a national NOCTI exam
- NOCTI exam can be taken at the high school or college level to assure that the students meet the competencies of the course
- This test was developed by subject matter experts within Minnesota specifically for the HCCC course

 - Death and dying, and how that affects clients and their families.

Content: 16 hours

- Interpersonal communication, team communication
- Documentation and reporting
- Use of electronic communication devices in health care facilities
- Development of effective communication skills to support quality client care

- Ethical decision making in healthcare

Content: 8 hours

- Client rights and responsibilities
- Confidentiality, liability
- Documentation and regulation
- Relationship between ethics and legal issues
- Impact law and regulation have on healthcare systems.

Content: 8 hours

- Personal belief systems
- Belief systems and practices of diverse cultures
- Personal responsibility to show respect
- Appropriate workplace expectations and interactions with diverse populations
- Problem solving techniques

Module 7 Healthcare Safety & Standard Precautions



Content: 8 hours

- Principles and standards of infection control
- Standard precautions
- Hand washing and gloving
- Safety policy and procedures in facilities
- Procedures to respond to emergencies.

- Modules can be offered in any order
- Modules can be packaged in 0.5, 1, 2, 3, or 4 credit course(s)
- Modules are customizable...





How do colleges use the HCCC?

- As a means of career exploration
- As a foundational course for allied health programs
 - which can be taken either at the High School
 - or Technical/Community College level
- Examples within the Minnesota State college and universities system of programs using the HCCC to follow...





HCCC used as a Pathway to the Nursing Assistant

- Minnesota Department of Health has approved the HCCC
 - As a pathway to the Nursing Assistant
 - 128 hour HCCC/Nursing Assistant Skills (lab and clinical)
 - 64 hours of HCCC +
 - 24 hours clinical
 - 40 hours lab
 - Total: 128 hours
 - Must complete the "HCCC Educate the Educator" course to use the HCCC as a pathway to the Nursing Assistant






Two Approved Nursing Assistant Curriculums


- 1. 128 hour HCCC/Nursing Skills Lab/Clinical course
 - 64 hours HCCC
 - + 40 hours lab
 - + 24 hours clinical
 - Total: 128 hours
 - REQUIRED to have preapproved by MDH to use this curriculum
 - REQUIRED to track all 128 hours


- 2. 75 hours Minnesota State Nursing Assistant Course
 - 75 hours total (HCCC not required)
 - 16 hours clinical
 - 59 hours lab/lecture
- HCCC can be used as a pre-requisite (This is NOT REQUIRED with the 75 hour course but is a great foundation for students)


